Teaching and Learning throughout the year.



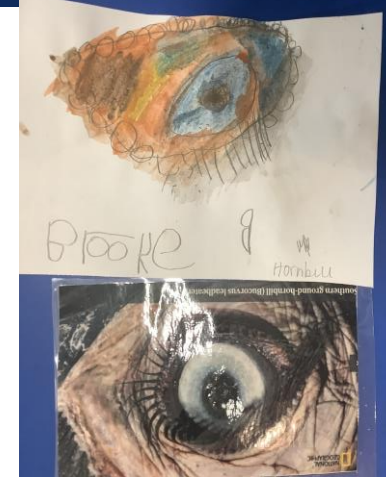

In KS1, children learn about different types of art (painting, sculpture and architecture) as well as exploring different movements in art.

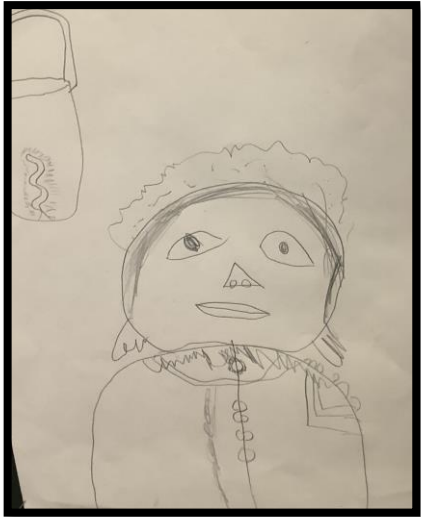


The children use Sketches School to create some of their art work. In Year 2, the children have been completing their own Andy Warhol inspired portraits using the APP.
