





Last week we looked at the traditional story of Jack and the Beanstalk. We have read many versions of this story and can make comments on similarities and differences.

Outside we enjoyed the sunshine. We were mark making with chunky chalks, pouring bubbly water, balancing on stilts and bouncing on bouncy hoppers.

We have been super busy mathematicians. We have been measuring beanstalks with cubes and comparing sizes using the correct language. We have been making beanstalk numbers where we have practised writing our own numbers and putting them in order down the beanstalk. We have beensubitising beans and matching them to the numerals. In small groups, we have been measuring heights with blocks and counting how many blocks tall we are.

In phonics, we have been looking at the initial sounds. We have been enjoying lots of phonics games and practising how to make the letter sounds. The children have been very interested in their names and have been practising writing them. We have been looking closely at the Little Wandle letter formation rhymes and practising them ready for some special cards we've made.

On the creative table, we have enjoyed some junk modelling and have been exploring how to connect boxes and toilet rolls to make our own castles.

We have been planting our own beanstalks. We looked at what we needed for our beanstalk plant and talked about what plants need to grow. We will watch closely and make comments on what we noticed.
