

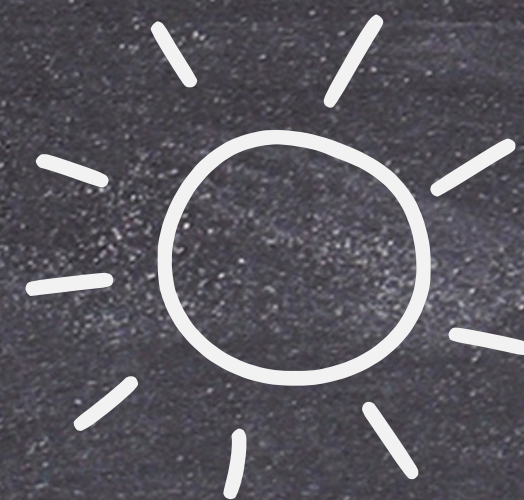
YEAR ONE~ OUR LEARNING SPRING TERM WEEK 2

Last week in Year 1, we thoroughly enjoyed exploring various methods of travel during our gymnastics sessions. The children practiced skipping, hopping, and jumping, and to our delight, some even introduced their very own unique styles of travel—one particularly creative example was "The Slug"! It was a joy to watch the children collaborate in teams of three to create sequences, and we are all eagerly looking forward to introducing jumps in our next lesson. In maths, our focus has been on understanding the place value of numbers between 10 and 20. The children have explored different ways of forming the teen numbers, and we've spent time discussing the significance of each digit. We are beginning to grasp that these numbers consist of a combination of tens and ones—for instance, 13 represents 1 ten and 3 ones.

Over in English, we continued our study of "Jack and the Beanstalk," diving deeper into the characters by building adjective banks to describe them. Using these adjectives, the children crafted sentences to describe each character and added extra detail with the conjunction "and."

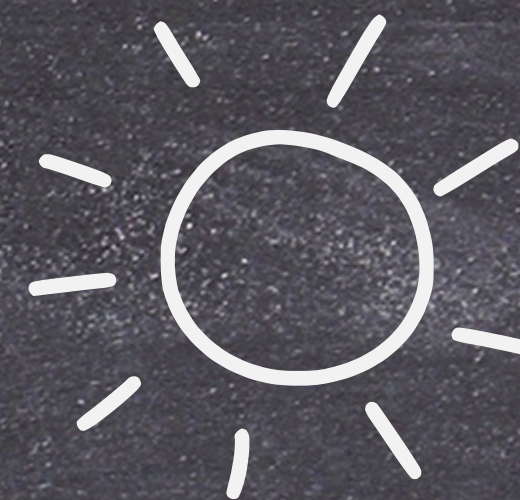
